


One of the many beautiful quilts brought in for "Show and Share" at January's meeting. Keep them coming ladies and see page 4 of this newsletter for some more pictures.

(or sashiko needle if you have it in your notions inventory) The needle should be approx. 2" long, sharp, not too thick and have a large enough eye to accept embroidery floss. Embroidery floss and material will be provided for one sample per quilter at the meeting.

KQG Resolutions











It's that time of year... you know, when all your resolutions of January are long forgotten about by mid February! That is why KQG is here to help with your quilting related resolutions with our Resolutions program. Jill Anderson is kindly heading up this venture once again. She has extended the deadline for last year's resolutions to be brought in till February and she is currently taking NEW resolutions for this year. For those members who are new or for those who have forgotten, here is how it works:

- * Resolutions usually begin in January of the current year and run till January of the following year (you can thank Jill for this year's extension!)
- * There are no limits as to how many resolution items each member submits. More resolutions can be added until the end of June.
- * The fee is only \$2.00 to sign up for resolutions no matter how many items you list!
- * Upon completion of the resolutions, the members name will be entered into a draw for a chance to win the money collected by the program at the end of the year.
- * Each item must be clearly identified as finished (ie quilted, bound and labelled) or unfinished (pieced top only). All items must be quilt related. Clothing items count if they are finished and quilted. Comfort Quilts can be used as submissions but only if they are finished (no quilt tops here).
- * When you complete a resolution bring it in before the end of the year and an executive member (or former executive member, Jill) must sign off /witness that the resolution was in fact finished for a chance at the final draw.
- * Please feel free to then add your item to the "show and Share" pile for the entire Guild to witness your masterpiece!
