News from Quilters' Corner Store

Planning is underway for the Simcoe County Quilt Rug and Craft Fair Sept. 18 – 20, 2015.

Each year I get questions about pricing for the Corner Store so I have put together a few notes. All sellers are responsible for pricing their own items but suggestions can be found on line at www.craftsy.com/blog, www.blog.etsy.com and www.makezine.com. You can also check out the price of items similar to your own at other craft fairs or quilt shows that sell quilted items.

An article by Gigi Khalsa in Quilters Newsletter Aug/Sept 2014 #441 also gives some great suggestions which I have summarized here (with permission). Generally, the cost of materials, an amount for labour and other expenses are included in calculating the price. Another option is cost of supplies multiplied by 2 or 3 as a simple pricing formula. Placemats made of batik fabric with intricate piecing are priced higher than simple blocks made with less expensive fabric.

Items which are considered original designs or art quilts are priced as art and merit a higher price than items made of traditional patterns and simple piecing. If you have developed an original design, count the cost of design time in your final total.

A fair market price sets a value on the work you and other quilters have done. The reasons for price differences by different sellers is often a source of questions in the corner store and volunteers have this discussion with them. The conclusion is the same as the introductory statement - all sellers are responsible for pricing their own items.

Forms for the quilt show will be available at the April meeting. You will notice some differences in the labels, requesting more information about the item. We are also using a separate sheet for each *Intent to Show* item. We are also looking for people willing to demonstrate a skill related to quilting as we have in previous shows at the museum.
